Argentina, Puerto Rico, Cuba, USA and Trinidad all winners in Pan Am Cup

Argentina and Canada played a breathtaking match in day one of the Women's Pan American Cup with the South American side prevailing in five sets.

Also teams of Puerto Rico, Cuba, USA and Trinidad & Tobago all came out victorious in this qualifier to next year's FIVB World Grand Prix.

Argentina v Canada

Argentineans Georgina Pinedo and Lucia Cuba v Brazil Fresco finished the match with 19 and 14 points respectively. Leticia Boscacci added 10 tallies. Canadian Sarah Pavan was the leading scorer with 23 points while Tammy Mahon, the Canadian captain, capitalized 14 points. Tonya Mokelki chipped in 10 tallies.

Puerto Rico v Costa Rica

Puerto Rico beat Costa Rica 3-0 (25-13, 25-15, 25-19) in the second match in Rosarito on Friday. The Puerto Ricans over matched their rivals 10-3 in the blocking category. Tatiana Encarnacion and Stephanie Enright topped the scoring

Trinidad & Tobago defeated Mexico 3-0 (25-21, 25-15, 25-23) in the last match of day one for its first victory in four years participating in the event. Krystle Esdelle and Kelly-Anne Billingy were the best scorers of the winners with 22 and 16 points respectively.
