Cuba and USA sit atop pool in Pan American Cup

TIJUANA, Mexico, June 20, 2010 - Cuba and USA became the first three-game winners of the Women's Pan American Volleyball Cup following their victories on Sunday.

The Cubans survived a tough match of five sets against Dominican Republic in Pool A while the Americans had an easy win over Trinidad & Tobago in Pool B of the competition where four teams get tickets to next year's FIVB World Grand Prix.

Elsewhere, Peru and Argentina recorded straight sets wins over Puerto Rico and Brazil and Mexico defeated Costa Rica in four sets.

Cuba v Dominican Republic

Cuba won a thrilling five-setter against Dominican Republic (31-29, 23-25, 25-19, 25-23, 15-12) and bettered its record in Pool A to 3-0 record while the Dominicans are now at 1-1.

Gisell Silva topped Cuba with 27 points while Kenia Carcaces contributed 21 to the winning effort. Rachel Sanchez and Yilian Cleger chipped in 12 and 10 respectively. Prisilla Rivera was the best Dominican with 20 tallies and Lisvel Eve, Milagros Cabral and Vargas charted 15, 14 and 13 respectively.

USA v Trinidad & Tobago

USA crushed Trinidad & Tobago 25-17, 25-9, 25-11 in a Pool B match between unbeaten teams.
