Dominican Republic, Peru and Argentina are in quarterfinals

TIJUANA, Mexico, June 21, 2010 - Dominican Republic and Peru secured berths in the quarterfinals of the Women's Pan American Cup while USA kept its unbeaten record in Pool B of the competition.

The Dominicans battled Argentina in four sets, Peru beat Trinidad & Tobago in straight sets and USA scored an easy win against a decimated by injuries Costa Rica team on Monday.

Ogonna Nnamani laced 19 points to lead the winners while Foluke Akinradewo and Jordan Larson charted 13 and 12. The Americans totaled 15 blocks and had a 7-0 advantage in aces.

Brazil v Canada

Brazil finally reached its first victory after defeating Canada 3-0 (25-21, 28-26, 25-21) in a match of the Pool A played at Reforma Sports Complex.
