

Players from 10 countries to compete at Rosarito Beach

BAJA CALIFORNIA, Mexico, September 15, 2011 - A total of ten countries and 20 couples will participate at the Norceca Beach Volleyball Circuit that starts on Friday in Rosarito Beach.

The last stop, played in Manzanillo was won by Mexico in both genders. Mexican teams lead the circuit with a total of 1020 points in the women's group, while in Men's group the host country has registered 1120 after six dates.

Players from every delegation attended to the preliminary enquiry on Wednesday prior to the beginning of the tournament, as well as the general technical meeting that was held at the "Americas" Ball Room of the Rosarito Beach Hotel.

Some of the players shared their impressions before the start of the competition.
