Both teams have 2-0 win-loss record while Mexico and Chile share the second place at 1-1. Nicaragua and Costa Rica are winless at 0-2.

In Monday's action, Dominican Republic and Argentina won in straight sets over Costa Rica and Nicaragua, while Mexico survived a 0-2 deficit to overcome Chile in five sets.

Argentina 3, Nicaragua 0

Argentina stormed past Nicaragua winning in straight sets 3-0 (25-8, 25-10, 25-8) for their second victory without losses. The South Americans scored 9 blocks and 15 aces in the victory over the weak Nicaraguans who suffered their second loss in as many outings. Anahi Tosi led Argentina with 21 points, including three aces, followed by Candela Nota with 10 points.

Mexico 3, Chile 2

Mexico pulled a sensational come-from-behind victory over Chile in five sets (21-25, 21-25, 25-22, 25-22, 15-11). In the first five-setter of the tournament, Mexico held the advantage in blocks 13-8 while Chile was better 10-7 in the aces category. Mexico's captain Maria Rodriguez led the winners with a tournament-high 25 points, including three serving aces. She was followed by Cristina Pantoja and Lourdes Castro with 15 and 14 points, respectively. Chile's captain Catatalina Melo topped her side with 20 points while Catalina Pulgar, Amalia Carvajal and Laura Sotomayor finished with 15, 14 and 12 points, respectively, in the loss.

Dominican Republic 3, Costa Rica 1

Hosts Dominican Republic kept their undefeated by improving to a 2-0 mark following an easy victory in straight sets (25-7, 25-9, 25-16) over Costa Rica. For second day in a row, the home team gave the fans a lot to cheer for with their spectacular serves and consistent blocking. The Dominicans held advantages of 11-2 and 9-2 in blocks and aces, respectively. Gaila Gonzalez led the winners with 16 points and next was Natalia Martinez with 13 points, including seven aces, and Angelica Hinojosa with five blocks among her 9 points.
