







## Dominicans are crowned at U20 Pan American Cup

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic, April 24, 2015 - The Dominican Republic captured the gold medal at the U20 Women's Pan American Cup by defeating Argentina 3-1 (25-20, 25-22, 20-25, 25-15) in front of a noisy crowd of over 3,000 spectators at Ricardo Arias Pavilion of Santo Domingo on 25-20, 25-18) in the match for the bronze Friday night.

Gaila Gonzalez, who was named the Most blocks and one ace, followed by the captain Valuable Player, had a tournament-high 26

The winners held a slight advantage in attacks 40-37 while the defeated side edged in the aces category 11-10.
