## USA and Dominican once again to meet in the Final Match

TRUJILLO & CHICLAYO, Peru, July 13, 2019 – Two-time defending champions United States and Dominican Republic will play for the gold medal of the Women's Pan American Cup for third consecutive year.

The representative teams of the two countries have clashed in the gold medal match in five of the last six years.

On Saturday, United States beat Colombia and Dominican Republic defeated Puerto Rico. The losers will play for the bronze on Sunday.

### United States 3, Colombia 0

Defending champions United States rolled past Colombia 3-0 (25-17, 25-14, 25-15) in the first semifinal clash. Madison Kingdon Rishel, Hannah Tapp and Kadie Rolfzen each had 13 points for the winners, while Brionne Butler added 10. For Colombia, Margarita Martinez and Amanda Coneo finished with 8 and 7, respectively.

### Dominican Republic 3, Puerto Rico 1



Dominican Republic defeated Puerto Rico 3-1 (25-16, 25-20, 27-29, 25-20) in the second semifinal battle. Brayelin Martinez had 25 points as the best scorer for the Dominican squad while Puerto Rican Paulina Prieto had a match-high 30 points in the losing effort.



### Argentina 3, Canada 1

Argentina defeated Canada 3-1 (25-20, 25-23, 24-26, 25-20) in the contest for the fifth place. Paula Yamila Nizetich had 25 points as the offensive leader of Argentina, while Lucia Fresco and Julieta Lazcano each added 15. Marie-Alex Belanger had 20 points for Canada, while Andrea Mitrovic and Shainah Joseph each added 16.



### Peru 3, Cuba 0

Peru won the match for the ninth place after defeating Cuba in straight sets 3-0 (25-20, 25-14, 25-19). Angela Leyva scored 18 points and Thaisa McLeod was next with 13 points. Greisy Fine with 9 points led Cuba while Claudia Hernandez added 8 in the loss.

### Mexico 3, Trinidad & Tobago 0

Mexico downed Trinidad & Tobago 3-0 (25-17, 25-13, 25-8) in the match for the ninth position. The Mexican girls outscored their opponents 12-1. Kathya Garcia and Alejandra Segura led the winners with 15 and 14 points, respectively.
