Costa Rica Women and El Salvador Men Dominate Central American U-23 Beach Volleyball Championship

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, April 27, 2025 - Laura Molina/Aliza Aguilar of Costa Rica and twins Yoel and Christopher Guardado of El Salvador won the title at the first Central American U-23 Beach Volleyball Championship. Molina/Aguilar won a hard-fought final 2-1 (21-14, 7-21, 15-11) against Nahima Silva/Norma Brenes of Nicaragua, who forced a third set after a strong showing in the second. In the end, the Costa Ricans secured the victory thanks to their effective serving and precise play along the lines. For third place, Karla Tovar/Daniela Vigil of El Salvador defeated Shanna Rivera/Zoe Ebanks of Honduras 2-0 (21-14, 21-12). For fifth place, Analia Díaz/Krisleen Gonzalez of Panama won 2-0 (21-19, 21-9) against Joselyn F López/Joselyn A López of Guatemala.

Nicaragua Women's and Costa Rica Men's U-21 Beach Volleyball **Champions**

MANAGUA, Nicaragua, April 27, 2025 - Yuliana Chavez/Elia Resau of Nicaragua and Julián Araya/Stanley Grant of Costa Rica won the XV Central American U-21 Beach Volleyball Championship. Yuliana and Elia defeated Mariana Fallas/Sofia Vega of Costa Rica 2-0 (21-13, 21-17) to claim the title. The Nicaraguans finished second in the round-robin stage, while Fallas/Vega remained undefeated in the first round. However, in the final, Chavez/Resau took the lead from the start with strong serving and defense. They maintained a slight advantage in the second set to secure the championship. Meanwhile, Keisy Janeth/Dayanaris Ríos of Panama won the bronze medal, defeating Fátima Rendón/Devora Medina of El Salvador in three hard-fought sets, 2-1 (21-17, 15-21, 15-13). For fifth place, Valery Rodríguez/Ruth Villegas of Honduras defeated Andrea Grijalva/Danna Aguilar of Guatemala 2-0 (21-8, 21-8).

Gumbs and Dyer registered a 2-0 (21-14, 22-20) win over Bermuda's Hailey Moss and Megan Hands in the gold medal match. Before facing off in the final, Gumbs/ Dyer had overcome Clio Phillip/ **Tenayestlni Joseph of St Lucia Team Three 2-0(21-**15, 21-18), while Moss/ Hands ensured that there will be a new champion, by defeating Grenada Team One of Thornia Mitchell/ Renisha Stafford, 2-0(26-24, 21-15). Dominica's Mingo and Frederick Defend ECVA U21 Men's Title with Back-to-Back Gold

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts & Nevis, June 8, 2025.-**Dominica's Mervin Mingo and Bill Frederick** were crowned ECVA U21 Men's Beach Volleyball Champions for the second year in a row, delivering a confident 2-0 win (21-17, 21-15) over St. Lucia's Victor Rio and Peter Emmanuel in Sunday's gold medal match at the scenic shores of Saint Kitts and Nevis. The Dominican duo reaffirmed their dominance in the region with another stellar performance, despite going through the round of 12 after finishing second in Pool A of the preliminary round, coincidently losing to St. Lucia's duo Rio/Emmanuel. In the championship match, Mingo and Frederick displayed control, keeping their composure under pressure and dictating the pace of the match. Their consistency and experience proved too much for the St. Lucian team, who fought hard but couldn't break through.

St. Lucia's Phillip and Ericka Crowned Undefeated ECVA U21 Women's Champions

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts & Nevis, June 8, 2025.-St. Lucia's Ericka Gaspard and Clio Phillip delivered a flawless performance at the ECVA **U21** Beach Volleyball Championship, capturing the women's gold medal with an undefeated 5-O record and without dropping a single set. In the final, Phillip and Ericka overpowered Antigua and Barbuda's Jassania Joseph and Jaya Carr in straight sets, 2-0 (21-11, 23-21), sealing their championship run in dominant fashion on the sands of Saint Kitts and Nevis. The St. Lucian duo controlled the opening set with authority but had to dig deep in the second after trailing 19-20. With calm under pressure and sharp execution, Phillip and Ericka rallied to close the match 23-21, completing their perfect tournament and claiming the gold medal. In an interview after the victory, Phillip said "We feel great, we are excited, we are happy.

United States strikes U19 gold!

KINGSTON, Ontario, June 28, 2025.- USA swept Mexico to claim gold at the U19 Girls' Pan American Cup at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario, Canada. Despite the determination of the Mexican side, the powerful young U.S. squad won the final 3-0 (25-21, 25-22, 25-21). Head coach of USA, Jamie Morrison, said: "It's a young team and we set the goal of getting better every single day that we are here and I thought we did that. All 12 players contributed to us getting into this match. I'm proud that it's their first gold medal in a USA uniform and the rest of the country should be proud of them too." The USA came out swinging and earned 48 points off attack, compared with 24 from Mexico. USA also had more blocking points (11-8). Mexico led in aces 9-5 and made fewer errors (11-23). Top scorer of the match was 14-year-old outside hitter Kari Knotts with 24 points (19 kills, 2 blocks, 3 aces).

USA Captures Third Consecutive Gold Medal at U19 Boys' Pan American Cup

CUERNAVACA, Morelos, July 13, 2025. – The United States achieved a remarkable third consecutive gold medal at the U19 Boys' Pan American Cup, sweeping host nation Mexico 3-0 (25-20, 25-21, 25-18) at the Universidad Autónoma del Estado de Morelos (UAEM) Gymnasium in Cuernavaca. USA's dominance in the tournament continues, having now won three straight titles, in 2022, 2023, and 2025, and four overall medals in the history of the event (3 gold, 1 bronze). This was Mexico's fifth consecutive appearance in the gold medal match, and although they were strongly supported by an energetic home crowd, they fell short once again. Mexico's only title came in 2017 against Chile; since then, they've collected four silver medals (2019, 2022, 2023, 2025). After two tightly contested sets, the United States surged to a commanding 14-8 lead in the third and never looked back. USA held a significant edge in attacks (45-29).

San Salvador, El Salvador, July 13, 2025 – Guatemala was crowned undefeated champion at the Second AFECAVOL Men's Senior Final Four, easily defeating El Salvador 3-0 (25-18, 25-20, 25-19) in the final match of the competition. Guatemala secured the championship with a perfect 3-0 record, while El Salvador failed to win a single match. Belize finished second, and Nicaragua third. The match against El Salvador was the only one in which Guatemala could breathe easy, as they had to battle through five sets to win their previous matches against Nicaragua and Belize.

Trinidad and Tobago battle to CAZOVA Under-23 Men's title

MALONEY, AROUCA, TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, JULY 13, 2025: Host Trinidad and Trinidad were crowned the first champions of the Caribbean Zonal Volleyball Association (CAZOVA) Under-23 Men's Championship hosted by the T&T Volleyball Federation (T&TVF) at the Maloney Indoor Sports Arena on Sunday. This was after the Calypso Spikers led by captain Nicholas Williams defeated Suriname in a sometimes heated but enthralling contest 21-25, 25-20, 30-28, 23-25, 15-10 with the captain rightfully sinking the match winning point for the host off a failed block by Suriname. The win avenged a loss also in five sets to the same opponents in their final round-robin match on Saturday night and secured the lone qualification spot to the Junior Pan American Cup next year.





Martinique dethrones Suriname as CAZOVA Under-23 Women's Champions

MALONEY, AROUCA, TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, JULY 13, 2025: Martinique lifted the title in the Caribbean Zonal Volleyball Association (CAZOVA) Under-23 Women's Championship hosted by the T&T Volleyball Federation (T&TVF) when they dethroned Suriname (3-1) at the Maloney Indoor Sports Arena. Inspired by France-based captain Maelyss Melinard-Chanteur, Martinique was made to work hard for their victory by a stubborn Suriname team who won the first set, 25-23, before the eventual champions prevailed 25-15, 25-21, 25-19 to seal their ticket to the Junior Pan American Cup next year.





Puerto Rico claims third consecutive NORCECA Women's Final Four title

MANATÍ, Puerto Rico, July 20TH, 2025.- Puerto Rico secured a three-peat victory defeating Mexico in an exciting five-set thriller (25-19, 24-26, 25-18, 20-25, 15-13) in NORCECA Women's Final Four celebrated in Juan Aubin Cruz Abreu Coliseum at Manati, Puerto Rico. With the win, Puerto Rico books a direct ticket to the 2026 Senior's NORCECA Women Olympic Continental Championship. This is the third gold medal in a row for Puerto Rico in this event and 5 medals overall since they won silver in 2019 and bronze in 2022. For Mexico this is their second consecutive silver medal, in the past edition of 2024 they also fell to Puerto Rico. They have a bronze medal won in 2019 and a gold medal winning the championship to Puerto Rico in 2022. Puerto Rico finished the NORCECA Women's Final Four undefeated with 3-0 record and Mexico with 2-1.

Belize undefeated champion of the VII Central American Women's Under-23 Championship

Belize City, Belize, July 24, 2025 – The Belizean team was crowned undefeated champion of the VII AFECAVOL Central American U-23 Women's Championship, after defeating Guatemala 3-1 (25-9, 25-15, 21-25, 25-10) in the final match of the tournament. This is Belize's first title in this category, achieved with a perfect record of four wins and no losses, while Guatemala finished in second place with a 3-1 record.Belize's superior power proved decisive, outscoring their opponent 44-32 in attack points. They also outperformed Guatemala in serving, scoring 17 points to their opponent's 4.

United States, Three-Time Champions of the U21 Pan American Cup

ALAJUELA, Costa Rica, July 27, 2025.- The United States reaffirmed their continental dominance by claiming their third consecutive title at the U21 Women's Pan American Cup, defeating Chile in straight sets 3-0 (25-18, 25-14, 25-13) at the Profesor Jorge Luis Solera Gymnasium in the Monserrat Sports Complex in Alajuela, Costa Rica. The U.S. team captured the crown undefeated and without dropping a single set, earning their fourth title in the history of the tournament (2017, 2022, 2023, and 2025) and their third in a row. For Chile, this silver medal marks their best result in the category after previously winning bronze in 2015. From the very start, the United States set the tone, taking an early lead in the first set that gave them confidence to close it out. In the second set, the American block came alive, allowing them to maintain full control of the match. The statistics underline the champions' superiority: 42-15 in attacks, 10-2 in blocks, and 8-2.

PUEBLA, Mexico, July 27, 2025 – An intense five-set match took place tonight at a BUAP Arena full of Mexican fans. The home team was motivated and took the lead in the first set, but Puerto Rico found motivation and national pride, rallying and securing victory with a score of 3-2 (23-25, 25-21, 22-25, 25-17, 15-9). The small point difference between the two teams was in blocking and serving. Puerto Rico made 15 effective blocks, compared to 10 for the Mexican team. In aces, Puerto Rico scored 6, while Mexico only 2. In attacks, both teams were consistent and scored a similar number of points, with a difference of 1, for a total of 51 for Mexico and 52 for Puerto Rico.

SPANISH TOWN, Jamaica, August 3, 2025.- The inaugural CAZOVA Under 17 Championships ended on Sunday with the all-conquering Suriname women and Barbados men duly taking the titles. The women's final between unbeaten Suriname and Barbados was close from start to finish. While the Bajans relied on their all-round strength and court craft to manipulate games, their opponents leaned on the prodigious thirteen-year-old MVP, Zoe Roethoj, to propel their attack. The first set was close. It took service errors to determine the tie-break with Suriname prevailing 29-27. developed not dissimilar to the first, with the teams' swapping leads but sticking close. Barbados middle blocker Gabriel Sandiford and Cuzera Batson, a dependable server, worked hard to be difference makers.





Venezuela Crowned Undefeated Champion of the Men's Pan American Cup

LEÓN, Guanajuato, August 31, 2025.— Venezuela was crowned undefeated champion of the 18th Senior Men's Pan American Volleyball Cup after defeating Mexico 3-1 (25-23, 25-20, 20-25, 25-19) in the gold medal match that closed the event at the Domo de la Feria in León, Guanajuato. This title marks Venezuela's first-ever gold medal in the history of the Pan American Cup, adding to the bronze medal they earned in 2015. Host nation Mexico claimed the silver medal, the second in its history, bringing their overall tally to four medals: one gold, one silver, and two bronze. Venezuela finished undefeated with six victories, 15 sets won and only three lost. Mexico closed the tournament with a record of four wins and two losses, placing second. Venezuela prevailed in attack (50-42) and blocking (10-8), while Mexico outperformed in service points (5-2). USA Crowned Undefeated Champion at 2025 NORCECA Women's Final Six

GUADALAJARA, Jalisco, September 21, 2025. – The United States captured the gold medal at the 2025 NORCECA Women's Final Six, defeating Mexico 3-0 (25-19, 25-17, 25-19) on Sunday at Unidad Deportiva López Mateos to finish the tournament as the undefeated champion. The U.S. closed the event with a perfect 7-0 record, while Mexico finished 5-2 – their only two losses coming against the Americans. 

SAN JOSÉ, Costa Rica, November 9, 2025. – The United States captured the gold medal at the 2025 NORCECA Girls' U17 Continental Championship, earning a spot at the 2026 FIVB World Championship, after defeating defending champion Mexico 3-0 (25-20, 25-12, 25-23) on Sunday at the Gimnasio Nacional in San José, Costa Rica. The United States completed the tournament undefeated (5-0), without dropping a single set, to win gold in their first-ever participation at the NORCECA U17 Continental Championship. Mexico finished with a 4-2 record, with both of its losses coming against the United States. This is Mexico's second medal in the event, having won gold in the inaugural 2023 edition.

Kurt Jimmal Peltier led all scorers with 18 points, comprising 12 kills, 5 blocks, and 1 ace. Peter Sherron Vidal followed closely with 17 points, and Larian Tulloch contributed 12 points to the team's overall success.
